Charco del Palo

The neighbourhood: the naturist village Charco del Palo near Mala on the Northeast coast of Lanzarote.

The bungalows of Charco Natural are part of Charco del Palo, a quiet naturist village near Mala on the Northeast coast of Lanzarote and far from the mass tourism. It is an open naturist zone on the Atlantic Ocean, where everyone can walk around the way he/she likes. There are no clothing regulations, except for shops and restaurants.

Charco del Palo has several holiday apartment complexes, but the greatest part consists of private, roomy residences and bungalows. Many Germans form the regular inhabitants, but there also live people of the Canaries, Spain, Austria and Switzerland.

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Shops and Restaurants

A small supermarket, hairdresser and boutique are easily be reached by foot. There are more shopping possibilities in Guatiza (at 4 km) and in the fishing village Arrieta (at 6 km). In Charco del Palo you have the choice between four bars / restaurants. Regularly they organize grill parties and life music evenings.

Anyone who prefers more entertainment in the evenings may visit the tourist resort Costa Teguisse (at 12 km).

Walking, Swimming and Diving

Volcanic cliffs with footpaths and many small beaches form the coast. A natural pool and a beautiful tidal basin make swimming very attractive.

Diving and snorkel fans will meet here excellent conditions. The area is not very suitable for bad walkers.

Lanzarote

The most eastern island of the Canaries (Islas Canarias) — Atlantic, 115 km from the African Western coast — size 795 km², width 22 km, length 60 km — about 70 000 inhabitants plus on average 60 000 tourists (1.7 million per year) — mainly Roman Catholic — province of Spain.

The Island

Of all Canaries, Lanzarote is perhaps the most peculiar island of the archipelago. The island, with its many volcanoes, craters and black lava fields, presents a vision of dreariness at first sight. But the surprising variety of beautiful beaches, coasts with bizarre formations of lava and steep cliffs, and in particular the mysterious 'moon landscapes' consisting of black cones of volcanic ash and fields of lava provide an unforgettable impression.

Climate

Because of lack of mountains, Lanzarote has a desert climate: the wet trade winds pass the island, mostly without leaving a drop of rain. However, that is exactly what creates a perfect climate for the tourists: a rather constant temperature during the whole year (21 - 29 °C), with much sun and hardly any rain.

Entertainment and Sights

For those who, apart from the beach life, are above all looking for amusement parks and nightlife entertainment, Lanzarote is perhaps not the best choice. However, the island provides a number of attractive sights like cave complexes, a cactus garden, a bird park, many museums, local markets and many, many fascinating panoramas.
